

JEAN CASSE DIT ST. AUBIN (CONT.)

Wars were witnessed by Gariel St. Aubin whilst he was taking care of his old mother. Gabriel sold part of his farm to Charles Chauvin, the other part he conveyed on the 11 January 1775 for 2500 livres to Nicolas Antoine Moras, who bought Charles Chauvin's share on 14 April 1779 for 200 livres. The widow and heirs of nicolas Moras had thier claim confirmed by the U.S. 21 July 1807. Under French Government and also later under the English rule the conveyance of real estate was made by the interested parties before a Notary Public by a written document under Royal Seal, but these deeds were not recorded and therefore it is difficult to have the succession of title from the original grants to confirmation by the U.S."

" The children of John Casse dit St. Aubin and Marie Louise Gaultier were:

1. John Baptiste, b. 1708, Quebec; d. 1733, Detroit in small pox epidemic prevalent in that year.
2. Pierre Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1709, Detroit; d. 1794, Detroit
3. Marie Anne Casse dit St. Aubin was born at Detroit, in the evening of 5 October 1710; she married there 27 Oct 1726 Charles Chauvin. She died 17 January 1789 at Detroit.
4. Gabriel Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1712, Detroit; died the 2 March 1776 from a wound received while repairing his windmill which was the popular grist mill of the Detroit settlers at the "Grand Marais".
5. Noel Casse, b. 1713; d. 1797
6. Charles Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1715; d. 1801 (Assumption); was a partner with Gabriel Casse dit St Aubin in the grist mill
7. Agatha Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1716; d. 1808; married Nicolas "Niagara" Canrau
8. James Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1718; d. 1804
9. Catherine Casse dit St. Aubin, b. 1720; d. 1805
